"Historically, the term 'land art' is understood to refer to a group of artists who first came to prominence in the late 1960s–70s, among them Walter De Maria, Nancy Holt and Robert Smithson in America, and Richard Long, David Nash, Andy Goldsworthy and more in Europe.

Many works of land art exist only as photographs or texts.

Land art urges us to examine our relationship with the landscape and with nature. For this reason alone, in what may well prove to be the late Anthropocene, against a backdrop of climate crisis, land art is of vital importance."
